

Black Sacramento Tattoo

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Saniderm AfterCare/Tips:

You should leave the first piece of Saniderm that your artist has applied, on for roughly 24 hours. The next day you will remove the Saniderm wrap (to avoid pulling of hair, remove the wrap in the shower in the direction of hair growth). It will look like the ink has built up underneath, this is normal, just make sure you wash it all off with **Antibacterial Soap**.

After you've washed off your tattoo completely make sure that the entire surface of the tattoo and surrounding area is dry. Then you will apply the second piece of Saniderm as so:

- Peel off only the paper side of the Saniderm.
- Apply the sticky side to your tattoo, it will adhere to skin best if there is about an inch between the edge of the Saniderm and the tattoo. Try to avoid air bubbles if you can (but if they do appear it is okay).
- Now remove the plastic on the other side and press firmly so the Saniderm attach itself fully onto your skin. **Leave this piece on for 3-5 days!**

Extra Information from the Saniderm Website:

- If using glycerin soap, such as green soap, be sure to rinse thoroughly, as any residue will react with the adhesives and can cause binding and irritation. Avoid loofahs or scratchy wash cloths.
- If you do end up getting your Saniderm wet, it's no big deal! Saniderm stays on skin even when immersed in water so you can bathe, shower, and swim as normal. However, prolonged exposure to water will weaken the adhesion, so **avoid soaking**.
- Saniderm has always been a **100% vegan** product.
- Exercising and working out while wearing Saniderm is fine. However, be aware that sweating can weaken the adhesive of Saniderm and cause the bandage to come off prematurely. That being the case, we advise you to take it easy and keep the sweating to a minimum!
